UPDATES

Gladding, McBean & Co.'s Glendale Plant was not in Glendale, California. The Glendale Plant was in Los Angeles, California. Gladding, McBean & Co. had a manufacturing plant in Los Angeles prior to acquiring the property of the former Tropico Potteries. The Gladding, McBean & Co.'s Los Angeles plant manufactured brick products. The former Tropico Potteries became Gladding, McBean's Glendale plant manufacturing tile, terra cotta garden ware, and pottery. The Glendale plant was in Los Angeles which bordered Glendale, California, separated by the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks.

California Poppy was designed by Annette Honeywell, the designer of Desert Rose, not Mary Jane Winans. Mary Jane sculpted and adapted the design for the shapes of California Poppy.

The Apple Tureen, pedestal base would have been introduced in 1980.

Page 88

The date for the Desert Rose Salt & Pepper Shaker/Mill, Bulbous base set was discontinued in 1979. Desert Rose Salt & Pepper Shaker/Mill, Bulbous base 1971-1979.

Page 112

The pattern name is Wild Flower, not Wild Flowers, Wild-Flower, or Wildflower. Manufacturing Wild Flower was discontinued for the duration in January 1943. You could order Wild Flower, but only for stock on hand. Another glaze finish was available for Wild Flower – Satin Matt in 1943, in addition to the Bright Gloss glaze finish. (Wild Flower in the January 1943 Franciscan Ware Price List).

Wild Flower was not manufactured after 1942. The salt & pepper were added after July 1942 and prior to September 1942 as evidenced in this advertisement in the Pasadena Post: Wild Flower was designed by Annette Honeywell, the designer of Desert Rose and California Poppy.
